Basic Concepts of Theosophy

October 14 **Basic Concepts of Theosophy – INTRODUCTION TO THEOSOPHY – Group Study**

Dedicated to man's eternal search for the Divine, Theosophy could be described as a synthesis of religion, science, and philosophy. It asserts the fundamental unity of all existence and holds that all things, including both forms and consciousness, are evolving. Topics covered will include a discussion of the Theosophical world view and the objects of the Theosophical Society.

October 21 **RENAISSANCE MEDICINE AND ASTROLOGY – *Judith Hill***

Until 1666, Renaissance physicians were required to pass their exams in astrology before obtaining their medical license. Cosmobiology was once an essential and integral part of medical diagnosis, prescription and treatment timing. Renaissance physicians also used their knowledge of planetary timing for the harvesting and concocting of "super" medicines. They also practiced a primitive form of DNA exchange treatments, and other seemingly "magical" practices that are easily explained through knowledge of vibrational resonance. Contrary to modern portrayal, leeches and blood letting were a small part of the itinerary of these doctors, and only prescribed for specific cases. We have thrown out the baby with the bath water, with the result that a significant and useful body of medical insights, tools and remedials has been lost in the the fog of prejudice.

Our speaker, *Judith Hill*, will reveal to us the lost pages of our western medical history in this fascinating and unusual lecture! Judith is an award winning author of several titles, including "*Medical Astrology: a Guide to Planetary Pathology*"; "*The Astrological Body Types*"; and her newly published "*A Wonderbook of True Astrological Case Files*," co-authored with Andrea L. Gerhrz. Her lectures are guaranteed to be fact-filled, fascinating and useful.

SPIRITUAL ALCHEMY AND THE HISTORICAL TAROT – *Michael S. Howard*

A comparison of alchemical drawings with the imagery in contemporary forms of the tarot reveals an amazing similarity, as each describes the soul's journey to enlightenment. In this lecture we will compare the 22 major arcana as they looked in the 15th-17th centuries with alchemical imagery of the same time, to reveal similar sequences of spiritual purification. The slides will include rarely seen images from three 15th century manuscripts.

Michael S. Howard, Ph.D. graduated from Reed College and has Ph.D.'s from Cornell University (philosophy) and Pacifica Graduate Institute (clinical psychology). He has taught at the State University of New York at Albany and Portland State University. He is a long-time member of the Queen of Heaven Gnostic Church in Portland, where he gives occasional slide presentations on spiritual themes. He is a "close cooperator" of Trionfi, a tarot history organization based in Germany (trionfi.com), and a member of Le Tarot Associazione Culturale in Italy, for whom he helps on Italian to English translations. November 4 **Basic Concepts of Theosophy – THE THEOSOPHICAL VIEW OF MAN AND HIS SEVEN FIELDS** – Group Study

Interpenetrating the dense matter of our physical world are other "higher" planes or fields composed of finer grades of matter vibrating at higher frequencies. In the same way, man also has "higher" bodies composed of these finer grades of matter interpenetrating his dense physical body. Today's study group discussion will cover man's seven fields and his vehicles of expression on them.

November 18 **THE WAR OF THE OLYMPIANS IN THE ILIAD** – *Patricia Fulbright*

Homer's epic poem tells of key events late in the Trojan War, events triggered by Achilles' rage at losing his war prize, the lovely Briseis, and his refusal to fight with the Greeks. Events unfold as a double story: one narrative line follows the conflicts and sufferings of humans engaged in war, while the second story line transports us to Olympus, where we hear Father Zeus' divided family scheme and compete among themselves. The Olympians have taken sides in the war, maneuvering to ensure their favorite warriors win great glory and ultimate victory. This lecture will showcase events depicting the role of the Olympians in the Iliad and will discuss the complex and often mysterious relationship between gods and humans.

Patricia Fulbright has taught classical mythology for many years at Clark College, Vancouver, Washington. She is a lifelong student of classical Greek mythology and philosophy.

January 6 **Basic Concepts of Theosophy - REINCARNATION - Group Study**

January 20 **INTRODUCTION TO THE BHAGAVAD-GITA - Judith Sugg**

The *Gita* is considered one of the most important texts in Hinduism and yoga. It is revered and esteemed as a philosophical and religious text of great depth, beauty, and wisdom. It intrigues us with its story, nested in the great epic, the *Mahabharata*.

Here is what Gandhi (1925) said about this small text: "When disappointment stares me in the face and all alone I see not one ray of light, I go back to the *Bhagavad-gita*. I find a verse here and a verse there and I immediately begin to smile in the midst of overwhelming tragedies, and my life has been full of external tragedies. And if they have left no visible, no indelible scar on me, I owe it all to the teachings of the *Bhagavad-gita*."

In this two-part program, we will look at the major teachings of the *Gita*, discuss its meaning for us today in America, see how it fits within the landscape of Indian philosophical texts, and hear the story that has intrigued readers all over the world. The program will be interactive. If you have a copy of the *Gita* (any translation), please bring it to the program.

Judith Sugg, Ph.D. has been practicing and teaching hatha yoga for 20 years. In her dissertation, she compared the Yoga Sutras and Samkhya Karikas from a psychological perspective. She is a licensed counselor and teaches psychology as an adjunct instructor. She is a long-time member of the Theosophical Society.

Exploring C.G. Jung's Red Book

1. **Dr. Hoeller's Exploration of Jung's Red Book Begins: Background and Book I; Chapter I** Book I is entitled "The Way of What is to Come"; its first chapter is introduced by "The Spirit of This Time" and "The Spirit of the Depths" and is entitled "Refinding the Soul". 69 minutes..
2. **Jung's Red Book, Book I; Chapters II, III, IV, V:** Soul and God; On the service of the Soul; The Desert; Experiences in the Desert; Descent into Hell in the Future. 71 minutes.
3. **Jung's Red Book, Book I; Chapters VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI:** Splitting the Spirit; Murder of the Hero; Conception of the God; Mysterium Encounter; Instruction; Resolution. 86 minutes.
4. **Jung's Red Book, Book II; Chapters I, II, III, IV, V, VI:** The Images of the Erring; The Red One; The Castle in the Forest; One of the Lonely; The Anchorite; Days I and II; Death. 83 minutes.
5. **Jung's Red Book, Book II; Chapters VII, VIII, IX, X, XI:** Remains of Earlier Temples; First and Second Day; Incantations; The Opening of the Egg. 80 minutes.
6. **Jung's Red Book, Book II; Chapters XII, XIII, XIV, XV, XVI, XVII:** Hell; The Sacrificial Murder; Divine Folly; The First, Second, Third and Fourth Nights. 79 minutes.
7. **Jung's Red Book, Book II; Chapters XVIII, XIX, XX, XXI:** The Three Prophecies; The Gift of Magic; The Way of the Cross; The Magician. 79 minutes..
8. **Jung's Red Book, Conclusion of the final chapter of Book II:** The Return of Salome; Encounter with Satan; The Kabiri; The Royal Son. 91 minutes.
9. **Jung's Red Book, Scrutinies Part 1:** More teachings of the Soul; Predictions of darkness: Beginning of World War I. Reappearance of Philemon, The Shadowy Woman, Conjunction of the Dead. 84 minutes.
10. **Jung's Red Book, Scrutinies Part 2:** The first four of the Seven Sermons to the Dead, with commentaries of Philemon. 84 minutes.
11. **Jung's Red Book, Scrutinies Part 3:** The remaining three sermons of the Seven Sermons to the Dead; Philemon's commentaries and discourse. 58 minutes.
12. **Conclusion of the Red Book:** How to treat Gods? The identity of Philemon. The mysterious Shade in the Garden. Excerpts from Appendix C. 83 minutes.
13. **How to Approach and Understand the Red Book:** Dr. Shamdasani advises us to study Jung's essay on the Transcendent Function to approach the Red Book. We will review this important essay in the light of our exploration of the Red Book. A summary of the Red Book's main teachings. 84 minutes.
